## **The RAAC Association's beginning**

**During WW2 most Australians who served in Armour did not get the chance to serve outside of Australia. When peace came, these men and their leaders were aware that they might lose their identity as members of a unique army because, through no fault of their own, they had not been sent to serve overseas. Shortly before demobilization at Southport Camp, Queensland in September 1945, the members of the 4th Armoured Brigade Group, led by (then) Brigadier Denzil Macarthur-Onslow voted to start the Australian Armoured Corps Association, which has been active in all States of Australia since then.**
